Phil Cotv of Niceville has been inducted into the Emerald Coast Chorus Hall Of Fame for 2010. Phil ioined the Emerald Coast Chorus in 1987. He has sung in several Ouartets. He sand bass in Harbor Knights quartet, formed in 1989: they competed at District Contest in 1993 and 1995. He sang bass in the Heartlight quartet. One year, the Heartlight quartet sub-

stituted in the annual show for the Society Gold Medalists, the SUNTONES, who were unable to travel due to a freak Florida wind and snowstorm. Heartlight renamed themselves the SNOWTONES for that night.

Phil was Chapter Barbershopper Of The Year for 1989. He has held a number of offices over the years (and has attended Chapter Officer Training School). He has served as Program VP, Membership Development VP, Music VP. He also served as our Chorus director for 1994 through 1996. He has received seven Men of Note awards. These are awarded for each new member recruited. He moved to Eufaula, Alabama following his wife's calling to the ministry there, but continued membership in all the years he was away. He was Emcee for one of our shows and sang as a chorus member in several others while living away. He attended and contributed to every annual Timpoochee Festival, except one. He single-handedly organized and executed our chapter's 30th anniversary celebration in May 2008. He is now co-chairman of the Joe Breedon Panhandle Regional Festival (Timpoochee). He richly deserves the honor of being named to the Emerald Coast Chorus Hall Of Fame.

Charter Member Joe Breedon started the Hall Of Fame modeled on what some other chapters in Sunshine District were doing. Induction requires 20 or more years of significant contribution by a member to the Emerald Coast Chorus.
